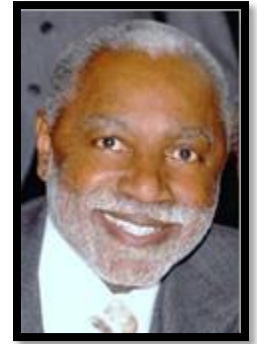


## About Dr. Nathan Butler
