

Kenya “Distant Learning Program”

This Distant Learning program is an extension of Washington Baptist Theological Seminary. The course study has been primarily tailored for the church and ministry community in Kenya; Nairobi, Nakuru and surrounding area. This program as outlined is approved by Kenya Higher Christian Education (Certificate and Diploma) and the curriculum as outlined is the standard structure. The classes will be held once a week for two hours. Class sessions will utilize video conference technology via the internet (where possible) or access to prerecorded voice sessions until such technology can be coordinated at both ends. Along with study notes and outlines provided by the instructor, at each session (if possible) there will be an instructor on site to answer any questions that the student may have. The students will prepare the required papers and submit them electronically. The papers will be reviewed by the faculty here in the USA and respond accordingly to the students. Certificates and Diplomas will be awarded to the students that complete the program. Students that successfully complete all three modules will be awarded a Master of Arts in Biblical Studies

Certificate - 3 Month (12 weeks – 2 hours per session)

- Old Testament Overview
- New Testament Overview
- Christian Evangelism
- Survey of Bible Doctrine
- Elements of Bible Study

Advanced Certificate - 6 Month (24 weeks – 2 hours per session)

- Survey of Bible Doctrine 2
- The Church and its Doctrines
- Major Prophets
- Romans
- Pauline Epistle (I, II Corinthians)

Diploma - 12 Month (52 weeks – 2 hours per session)

- Acts
- Christian Apologetics
- Ethics
- Introduction to Psychology & Philosophy
- Hermeneutics
- Homiletics
- Sermon construction – a sermon outline & sermon

If a student satisfactorily completes all three segments, they will be awarded a Master of Arts in Biblical Studies if the prerequisite of Certificate Programs(s) are satisfied
